EBMT DATABASE AND TRAINING

Since MACRO development was discontinued and collecting cell therapy data on ProMISe is unsatisfactory, an alternative cell therapy data collection method called Castor. You can find out more about Castor via:

The new database to replace ProMISe is also in its final development stages. EBMT has been engaging National registries, users, and stake holders in several workshop meetings to help shape this into a more user-friendly tool. **As a result, the BSBMTCT Registry will no longer be offering ProMISe training to users for now.** Free training materials are available on the EBMT website. SOME GVHD RECURRENCE DATA ENTRY TIPS

- Are you wondering how to record GVHD recurring in your annual follow up data entry? In the “**Complications and additional treatment**” chapter and the “**GVHD**” section, the data field called “**Chronic graft versus host disease (cGvHD)**” has options codes 1 to 7. Codes 4 & 7 are the codes you need. Although these codes capture recurrence of GvHD, they are used slightly differently.
- You can use **code 4 - “Yes, recurrence”** if cGvHD was resolved **at** the last FU, and now is recurring
- You can use **code 7 - “Resolved but recurred since last reported episode”** if cGvHD resolved **after** the last FU and then recurred again so the resolution wasn't captured at the time of the last follow-up.
